To achieve these goals, Maulana Azad Library is organizing the **3rd One Week National Workshop on Koha and DSpace** from 09-14 February 2026. This intensive six-day training will equip participants with practical expertise in implementing Koha for library automation and DSpace for digital repository development.

The workshop aims to enhance professional capacity in Free and Open-Source Software (FOSS), enabling libraries to modernize operations, expand digital services and ensure equitable access to knowledge.

Koha is a fully web-based, feature-rich Open-Source Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) built on international standards such as MARC21, UNIMARC, and Z39.50. With modules covering Acquisition, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serials, OPAC, Patron Management and more, Koha is widely used by libraries globally for its flexibility, scalability, and strong community-driven development.

DSpace

DSpace is an open-source digital library platform designed to build institutional repositories, digital archives, and scholarly communication systems. It supports a wide range of file formats documents, multimedia, datasets and ensures long-term preservation, indexing and global visibility through metadata standards and harvesting protocols like OAI-PMH.

About Aligarh Muslim University

Maulana Azad Library (ISO 9000:2015) is the Central Library of the Aligarh Muslim University which is famous for its invaluable collections of manuscripts, rare books and artifacts. The library currently holds approximately 14 lakh volumes of books and subscribes to a wide range of leading research journals and databases. The library meets the needs of its faculty members, research scholars' students and other academicians with a wide range of library services provided by more than 110 departmental libraries including five major college libraries. One of the most features of the library is its Manuscript Division, which houses about 16,117 rare and invaluable manuscripts especially oriental languages and related disciplines.

It is noteworthy that Maulana Azad Library has successfully migrated approximately six lakh bibliographic records from proprietary software to the open-source Integrated Library Management System i.e, KOHA. In addition, the library has developed and manages three fully functional Institutional Repositories using the DSpace platform. It is a world-famous repository of manuscripts and rare books. These repositories significantly enhance the global accessibility, visibility, and long-term preservation of AMU's intellectual output and unique heritage collections.
